## **Independent Study**

For those who would like to work alone or with another person without an instructor, e.g., writing, painting.

## **Beginner/Intermediate Stained Glass**

#### Instructors/Artists: Ethel Wright, Nancy Brockway, Donna Stokely, & Jere Stokely

Participants will build a simple stained-glass panel using the copper foil or lead method; you will learn basic stained glass techniques, including: glass cutting, breaking and grinding, the copper foil (Tiffany) or leaded glass construction method and soldering.

## **Advanced Stained Glass**

No instructor is provided, participants work independently and offer support to each other.

This class is open to those with prior stained glass experience and the ability to work independently. Participants provide their own tools and supplies. **\*Must have approval before signing up for this class\***

## Woodturning

Instructor/Artist: John Ballard

Learn to turn a bowl, make honey dippers, antique pepper grinders, and do spindle turning, such as rolling pins and writing pens. Each participant from beginner to experienced turner will work at their own pace and skill level. Bring wood turning tools if you have them. Otherwise, tools will be provided. Please bring a dust mask and eye protection. Feel free to bring your favorite wood blanks for turning that special creation.

## Treat Basket with Cane Accents Instructors/Artists: Annette Roose & Michele Payne

This large market style basket is constructed around a 10 inch flat D handle. The dimensions of this rectangle basket are 15" long by 10" wide by 5¼" tall (10" tall at the handle.) This basket can accommodate a large amount of baked goods or your favorite casserole dish. The walls are woven with natural reed and accents of brown reed and binder cane. This basket can be completed during the folk school, focusing first on the open weave base incorporating the D handle, then weaving the walls, and finally, a flat rim/filler that is lashed with cane. Basic weaving techniques will be introduced with an emphasis on shape. Additional kits may be available depending on class size. See the pictures below for some examples.

## Introduction to Shibori folding techniques and Indigo Dye Instructor/Artist: Lida Waugh

Beyond Rubber Bands!!!: Introduction to Shibori folding techniques and Indigo dye.

Shibori folding and dyeing on cotton dates from 17thc Japan when silk was prohibited from use by the lower classes. Intricate folding, blocking, and stitching processes were developed to create interesting repeating patterns. The indigo plant (from India) produces the deep blue color traditionally used for shibori. It is an anaerobic, cold dye process. Quilters and other fiber artists can create samples to incorporate in other projects. You may also bring a ready-made garment to add patterns to. I know you're just "dyeing" to give it a try! See you in October!

## Knitting Instructor/Artist: Marie Brown

Beginners: learn the basics about casting on & the knit stitch while working on a garter stitch scarf. Intermediate knitters: take your knitting game up a notch by learning to knit in the round & dropping stitches (yikes!) while working on a cowl.
